

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Recently on Father's Day, my children gave me the DVD "Cliffy", a story about the 61 year old Victorian potato farmer who won the Sydney to Melbourne Ultra-marathon. In preparing for the race he had to try and manage to get his distance per day up to something like 125km. I don't know about you, but I think the greatest distance I have ever run has been about 13km, in the Senior Cross Country, when I was at school. It was completely exhausting! I can't even



imagine what it must be like to run 125km in a day, not to mention the whole 862km, as it was then to Melbourne. It makes one weary to even think about it!

At around the same time I have also been reading a book by that title, "Weary" which is a biography of the life of Sir Edward Dunlop. As a Prisoner of War in WWII, first in Java and then on the Thai-Burma railway, his race was of a different nature. It was a race to stay alive and keep others alive. As he battled as a doctor amongst his troops with cholera, vitamin deficiency, malaria, not to mention the wounds inflicted by both harsh conditions and an often intolerant captive force with very slim supplies is an amazing story. It is a very detailed account of those times, and so takes quite a bit of getting into, but very well worth the effort.

Why am I raising these little snippets of 'running the race' you may well ask? To answer that is to realise that all of us in one way or another are involved in a race. The analogy of using a race to describe life is often a very apt one. There are often many priorities, busy lifestyles, urgent action that requires our attention etc. How important it is to realise Christ at the centre of all that has to be done and needs to be done in the course of a day, a week, a month, a year. Grounding this race in prayer and realizing Jesus presence with us as we meet the challenges is a vital one. Christ through his Holy Spirit can also help us NOT to miss what is important as we continue to run

As it is written in the Letter to the Hebrews (Heb 12:1a – 2a)

"Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfector of our faith."



**Report from National Secretariat held** in Mackay on the 19th to 21 July 2013

The National Secretariat meeting for this year was held in Mackay at St Charles Church. Three members of our secretariat attended Rev Ian Howarth, Cheryl Cooper and Jim Warland.

There were 35 delegates from around Australia gathered together to discuss the issues of Cursillo.

Friday evening was a "meet-and-greet" and we were well provided for by Dianne Catto & the local Parishioners

National LD Diana Smith welcomed members and visitors to National secretariat and on the Saturday Vince Cooney the LD from Bunbury presented statistics for an Air Fare Equalisation Scheme to spread the cost of attending National meetings more evenly over all Dioceses. There was quite a bit of discussion about this but nothing was resolved as each solution seemed to bring its own problem.

Some highlights from the other Diocesan Reports are as follows:


## A Pearl from ashes



#### GIVING HOPE TO INMATES.

BRINGING the word of God into the hearts of prison inmates might seem like a challenge too great to achieve. But for three Singleton men, it is something they do as part of the Kairos Regional Committee at the St Helier's Correctional Centre in Muswellbrook and their experience is one of great success.

It is about helping bring rehabilitation to the incarcerated through the

possibility of hope and positive choices.

The 1000 Kairos volunteers now working throughout Australia tell the inmates that they have a choice. Volunteers reach out to family and friends of those inmates by saying they are not alone and offer juvenile offenders the positive message that there is a better way ahead.

"At Kairos, we know we can't fix their problems or solve the causes, as people have to be allowed to make their own decisions, but we can help them to recognise, choose and live new lives," Mr Ruigrok said. "It also makes a difference to the wider society by helping to reduce the recidivism rate & therefore reduces the cost of further imprisonment."

"Kairos is making a difference to individuals, families and friends with whom we come into contact and it also makes a difference to the environment of the correctional centres we access and to the next generation as they experience a change in the family members who begin and therefore model, a lifestyle without crime," he (Hank) said. "It also makes a difference to the wider society by helping to reduce the recidivism rate and therefore reduces the cost of further imprisonment."

# "I was in Prison and you visited me" M+25:36

My name is Rod Thomson and I am the Lay Leader of the next Kairos at

Cessnock Correctional Centre.

Kairos 20 at Cessnock is well under way. We have about 30 people from most denominations, both lay and clergy, training together at the Anglican Church hall at

Beresfield on a fortnightly basis. Our training requirements of about 35 hours are spread over 7 training days. The Kairos Course is being ably assisted by Prison Chaplains, Reverend Di Langham (Anglican) and Major David Prigg (Salvation Army)

Much of our training focuses on learning about the need to obey the strict security measures within the Prison. We also learn about Prison Culture and some of the forces at work inside the walls. Kairos 20 is being held from 15 to 18 October. There will be 18 inmates as guests (candidates) and 4 inmate servants (gophers). The team tries to help the men feel a sense of family, by demonstrating the Love of Christ through our interactions with them. That's why we stay together as table communities for the 3.5 days.
