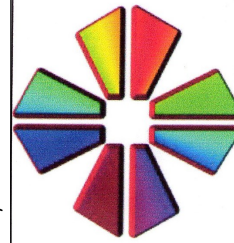

*May we all be enabled to embrace and enjoy the challenge and fun of the continuing journey, discipling with Christ, even when it hurts.*

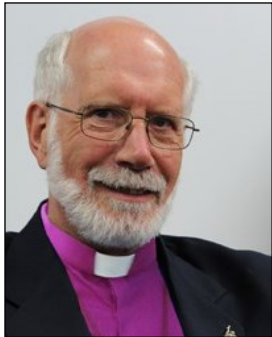

## NATIONAL SECRETARIAT NEWS

The Right Reverend Ian Palmer, BD, Dip. Th.L (The newly installed Bishop of Bathurst) was also recently appointed Episcopal Overseer of the National Anglican Cursillo Movement.

Bishop Palmer, 62, was born in the United Kingdom. He gained his Theology degree at King's College,

London, in 1971, and his post-graduate diploma at Durham University four years later. He served in parish ministry and university chaplaincy in the north of England prior to moving to Australia to take up a position as Director of Evangelism in the Diocese of Newcastle in 1990.

He held this position for three years before returning to parish ministry in the Newcastle suburb of Belmont and subsequently at Muswellbrook. He moved to his most recent appointment in Queanbeyan in the Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn in 2005.

During his time in Queanbeyan he also served as Archdeacon of South Canberra, and as Archdeacon of Chaplaincies.

He was also a member of the Management Board of Anglicare NSW South, NSW West and ACT, the welfare arm of the Anglican Church which now operates as an alliance across the Dioceses of Canberra-Goulburn, Riverina and Bathurst - an area covering almost three-quarters of NSW.

He is married to Liz, who has considerable experience as a spiritual director and leads residential courses in this field at St Mark's National Theological Centre in Canberra.

They have two adult daughters.

God is not necessarily "closer" to us when we have an Ullapool-type encounter. As Saint Paul put it, God is not far from any of us at any time. But in such moments of pleasure and aesthetic rapture our senses are peculiarly receptive to signals of divine existence.

Article from Brian Taylor M20 (Newcastle Diocese)

I was recently reading the book "Unseen Footprints" by Sheridan Voysey. It was awarded Australian Christian Book of the Year in 2006 and I would thoroughly recommend it. To quote from Tim Costello (CEO World Vision Australia), "Unseen Footprints will open your eyes to the God who is already present in your life and in this amazing world of ours. It invites us along a path of grace, true vocation and transformation." This story is taken from the book and may appeal to fellow Cursillistas.

"On a holiday to the United Kingdom a few years back, my wife, a friend and I picked up a hire car and set out for the Scottish Highlands. Our UK trip had been good up to that point, but our trek around the Highlands left us awestruck. For a whole week we feasted on the sensual delights of Scottish beauty-monstrous mountains with snow-capped peaks and heather-covered slopes, secluded villages with pipe-smoking locals, running streams and summer thunderstorms, ancient cemeteries and historic castles. When the sun shone every photo turned into a postcard, and when the rain fell (which it did frequently-the locals said we'd picked a bad summer) we enjoyed the crisp atmosphere outside and the warm fires inside our hostel.

On day four of our trip we pulled into a fishing town called Ullapool. Finding the local Youth Hostel Association's digs we lugged our gear inside and set out to see some of this harbour-side village. Ullapool's main street runs alongside the lake it lives off; and our hostel overlooked its shipping and trawling activity. After dinner the three of us headed to the common room for some relaxed trip planning and board games.

Scotland's summer days can last until midnight as daylight slowly ebbs away. Around 9pm I idly lifted my eyes from the Scrabble board to gaze out the window. What I saw caught my breath. "I have never seen that before!" I blurted out in a rare moment of social forgetfulness. Other guests followed my gaze and soon there was a rush for the stairs as people ran for their cameras. Within moments the whole village was standing on the stone wall alongside the lake with fingers pointing, camera's snapping, and eyes savouring the spectacle.

Right there in front of us was the end of a rainbow. For over an hour the rainbow's colourful beams shone majestically. Its arch stretched from the mountains on our left, rose high into the silver-blue sky, and ended what seemed like a hundred metres or so in front of us on the lake's surface. Before long the entire valley was drenched in an orange-pink glow as the setting sun filtered through the atmosphere. Our camera settings would never record the sight in its fullness. I have never seen anything else like it.
