

I am very humbled to be writing to you as the newly commissioned Diocesan Spiritual Director. This appointment certainly came out of "left field" as the saying goes.



The Cursillo Movement continues to play a significant role in the life of our Diocese. 

From the very first Sunday that we arrived in Cessnock some nearly 45 years ago we have been actively involved in Parish life. Except for holidays and unavoidable absences we have been regular members of the congregation and have both experienced pretty much most facets of church office with all its ups and downs. Judy and I ran the Alpha course at Cessnock for many years and have both since completed the Bishops Certificate and Diploma. Judy has been called to ordination as a locally ordained priest and I am a Eucharistic assistant and Lay Reader. I have business interests and enjoy a busy and productive existence with church and family life very much my prime focus.

If I was asked what particular area of concern would be my priority in this new administrative role for Newcastle Cursillo, I would have to say to bring more men into the Cursillo family. As a priest who has spent half a century serving the people of Port Stephens and the lower Hunter, **FATHER GARY PARKER** has become a familiar face around the area. The affable Anglican priest, known to many for his operatic baritone style voice, celebrated 50 years of service in December 2014. He was ordained at Christ Church Cathedral in Newcastle on December 19th 1964, and celebrated his first Eucharist the next day in vestments, made especially for the occasion by his wife Benita.

Before entering the priesthood Father Gary was a secondary school teacher with appointments to Kogarah Boy's High School, Casino High and Gloucester High. He studied theology at St John's Morpeth in 1962-63. Apart from three years as a missionary in Papua New Guinea, Father Gary spent his entire ministry in Newcastle Diocesan parishes in South Lakes, Kurri Kurri, Hamilton, Charlestown and Raymond Terrace.. Although retired for 12 years, he still regularly does relief work in the lower Hunter and assists in the Clarencetown parish, celebrating the Eucharist, performs marriages, funerals and baptisms and is still active as Karuah RSL Chaplain."

On 21st Dec Fr Gary celebrated his 50 years in the priesthood at the altar in St Columba's, Karuah with the local congregation. For the first time in his ministry he had Benita, his wife, assist with the chalice. That must have been a special moment for both Benita and Gary. The R.T St Johners who attended the service had a wonderful morning- memories plus! He's still got it!

While in the parish of Charlestown Fr Gary heard about the "new" Cursillo movement and he and a parishioner, Geoff Rigby travelled to Bathurst Diocese to make their Cursillo, at Men's 15, 1989 at Wellington. They returned to the Diocese with only the enthusiasm that attending a Cursillo can give and were instrumental in encouraging the Newcastle Diocese to bring the movement here. Fr Gary has, over the years, been on team as Spiritual Director (SD) and at the time of his retirement he was Diocesan Spiritual Director. Benita and Bev (Rigby) attended the Women's Cursillo W14, at St Faiths, Dubbo that same year (1989) Fr Gary was also on team as SD for the first Kairos at Cessnock gaol.

On two occasions Benita and Gary did parish exchanges in England. The first was in Swindon in the Diocese of Bristol in 1993 and Stanhope in the Diocese of Durham in 1997. These were great experiences both for them and the parishes involved.

Finally he was possibly the only priest in the Diocese and maybe even Australia to ride his motor bike down the aisle of the Cathedral to illustrate the 'parable of the Good Samaritan' for the combined Diocesan GFS and CEBS Rally dressed in jeans, singlet, bandana and boots!! Yes, things have changed!!! (Part story R.T. Examiner—Dec '14—thanks to Benita for extra info. & photos xoxx)

MANNING Forster/Tuncurry:

"Sticking poppies on strips of velcro loop to line the pathways for the war memorial rededication on 22nd Feb..... For ANZAC Day, we're using a pricing gun to attach the poppies to strips

from large sheets. These can then be spread out over the slope behind the memorial at Tuncurry. It's taking quite a bit of time and uses up lots of poppies to cover the sheets. We've given 500 poppies to each of the small local places so have well over 8,000 now we're using for different things. People keep making them and we really do need lots to fill the area we want to cover in Tuncurry. Some small ones with brooch pins have gone to RSL members who wore them on Remembrance Day and other similar ones to school children going overseas this year to different places such as France"
