

THE TRANSFIGURATION

A word that is sometimes mentioned concerning God's nature is

that aspect of God's nature and power that is wholly independent of – or beyond – the known material universe or physical laws; beyond our common human experience. It is a difficult concept to grasp, so we tend to concentrate on the physical aspects of our faith. Yet, as Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 4: ⁵For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. God gives us the gospel, the good news of Jesus Christ, so that we can begin to grasp something of what is beyond our human existence.

We say that God moves in mysterious ways – beyond what we can think of or imagine.

The fiery chariot which carried Elijah to heaven, the burning bush in Exodus and the dazzling brightness of Jesus on the mountain are biblical examples of the awesome nature of God.

We need not shy away from transcendent experiences like these, but should welcome them – even seek them since, throughout history, God has spoken in and through them.

Almighty God steps into our lives to give us an awareness of His amazing power and authority.

In Mark's description of the transfiguration of Jesus, we hear how some quite ordinary people were completely amazed by the greatness of God. It's a bit like a crash course in learning things about God. If you've ever been on a crash course for anything you soon come to realize that it's no good going on any kind of course unless what is learnt is put into practice.

Jesus had gone up the mountain with Peter, James and John and was transfigured right there in front of them. His disciples did not know what was happening, or why. Peter was so terrified when Moses and Elijah appeared on the mountain that he started to say things he did not quite understand. He was scared. The transfiguration was something of a crash course.

On the way down from the mountain, Jesus explained to the disciples that they were not to tell anyone what they had seen; not until after He had risen from the dead. He was preparing them for His own death – something they could not understand. It only began to make sense after Jesus had died, risen and returned to heaven. For now, they were aware that there were things they had to do, and so went on expecting Jesus to do great things. God does not do what we expect. Peter, James and John were caught up in awe and wonder at His power and might – at what we might call "transcendence".

God is bigger, greater and more amazing than the limited pictures we have of Him and He wants to communicate wonderful things to us.

The top of a mountain is an awesome site and offers an unforgettable vista. In the transfiguration account it was a place of revelation of God to human beings. The transfiguration shows us the splendour of heaven. We can only imagine what such an amazing encounter would have been like. Thankfully, we are the beneficiaries of this event – we have been called into a relationship with Jesus, the beloved Son of God. By listening to His word, and applying it to our lives, we are transformed. May our lives be transfigured by God this Lent.

Kotara South Ultreya

Was held on 15th September. There were 19 people in attendance – our Muso was Robert Joice & as you might imagine with Robert at the Helm the music & singing was excellent and uplifting. The witness talk by Fr Ken Youman was very inspiring.

Ken was born in Armidale and raised in a loving family of whom he spoke highly – When living in Stockton he attended YAF & became a Lay Reader. He, like most of us, reached highs and lows in his spiritual journey – some "mountain top experiences" but plenty of low "valleys". Sometimes God seemed so close and at other times it seemed he was nowhere to be found.

Ken found Cursillo and later on Alpha as mountain top moments where he felt close to God and felt the moving of the Holy Spirit.

Ken worked as an engineer at BHP but over the years found that he gradually developed 2 types of persona – one for the rough-and-tumble of work with the men at BHP and a different one for his Church life; until finally on one embarrassing occasion "BHP Ken" spoke out in his Church environment. Oops! In reflecting on this humiliating moment he realised that God was saying 'you can't go on being 2 different people just fitting in with the people around you – it is God we should be trying to please not other people.

This revelation changed the way he looked at his life.

He encouraged each of us present to examine our spiritual calling and to be true to our beliefs in all situations. He said it was this factor that helped him assist many of his men at BHP in coping and moving on when it closed; although there were still some who couldn't cope.

Ken had earlier tried theological study and over the years was encouraged by various mentors to consider his spiritual calling. It was only in his 50s that one persistent mentor again suggested that he might consider a call to the priesthood. He referred to these mentors as "the hounds of heaven".

And so it was that he approached the then Bishop and became accepted for the priesthood where he still serves in many capacities. Fr Fergus (our SD) gave an excellent review of the talk but pointed out that EVERYONE has a ministry for God – some are ordained to the priesthood but all Laity also have an important ministry. What is yours?

What a great group that was!

When Cursillo came to Newcastle a few months later, Keith was only too willing to be involved in helping to share the experience by being on team for M2, 3, 4, 6, then Lay Director of M13, and Assistant Proctor for M27. As well, he set up and faithfully kept up to date the Diocesan Cursillo Roll which grew into the 1000s, including printing Encourager labels, from the beginning and for 27 years, only relinquishing the job last year when he was unable to continue due to his cancer.

We miss this fine quiet trooper and give thanks for his life and his apostolic action.

GROUPING AFAR


