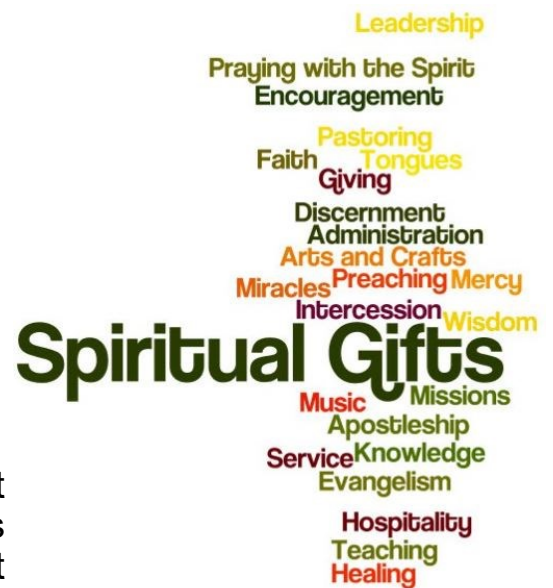

In 1 Timothy 4.14 Paul encourages Timothy to not neglect the gift that is in him. Cursillo encourages us to use our gifts in the 4th day, but this is tricky. What are my gifts? Are they really good enough? Doubt can undermine our self esteem so that we dare not use them.

How often do we look at someone so obviously gifted that we wished we were them? It is so easy to devalue and dismiss the gifts we have as being inadequate and not up to the task. Even really talented people have been known to doubt their own talent and suffer from insecurity that can lead to bouts of depression.

In the days before the internet and global communications, people didn't have the best and most talented people in the world to compare themselves to. The best singer in the village was celebrated for their gifts. They were the best and everyone appreciated them.

All gifts come from God and we are given the gifts that are needed for the mission and service we are called to. When we compare ourselves to other people we can start to doubt that God has given us what is really needed for the task.

I love the saying, "Be yourself. Everyone else is taken." God created us, as we are. God has given us our gifts and talents. God has a place for us in the community and expects us to exercise our gifts and talents.

Of course, we do need to look for opportunities to improve our gifts. Even members of Symphony Orchestras didn't start out with that amount of skill. Using our gifts regularly, looking for workshops to improve, and feed back on how we are going, can improve our skill and give us more confidence.

If anyone makes you feel like your gifts aren't good enough, remember St Paul's illustration of the body. All the parts of the body are needed and none can be excluded without compromising the body.

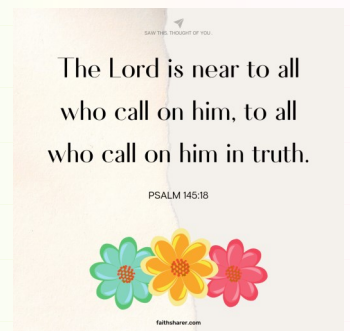

Greetings from Noelene and Geoff.

Welcome to the Winter Edition of the Encourager. Pray you will enjoy the read and will be able to respond to the requests in support of the success of Cursillo Ministry.



Secretariat has been giving thought to Table Communities a bit recently. How many of you remember going to first night team meeting to encounter, from the Lay Director: “Who do you think should be table leader out of the Candidates?” and you need to recommend someone from those people you just met and currently can’t talk to? Did you go into shock like I did? Then the old hand said “I think Fred (Julie, Charlie) would be good” because the old hand remembered that question was coming and was observing from the start. Someone is picked and another bit of the larger jigsaw is put in place.

So, when we are preparing for a weekend, there are all the talks and they are rehearsed, critiqued (criticised by some more judgemental types) and refined. This is only right. Some huge impact comes from the talks and they are the key to an “authentic” message. There are a lot of talks but you may be surprised (well, I was) that they total only about 4 hours (if each lasts about 15 minutes). Someone has added it all up and participants are in Table Communities about 75% of the time.

The Table Community is where we come out of our silos. It is where we process our thoughts on the talks. It is where the emotions can boil over and where Christian love is directly shared. Many years ago, at a service for hostel dwellers (most of whom are in some way damaged) the question was asked “Who is Jesus?” and one reply was “God with skin on.” Well, Jesus left us to it a few centuries ago, so the Table Communities have to start out with the Team members as God with skin on, no one else is available.

That raises another thing that has been on our minds a bit lately. 4th Day. How is your 4th day going? How many people see you as God with skin on? De Colores



PS – Someone is going to tell us Jesus left us the Holy Spirit. He did. But we are still called to be God with skin on.

Contribution from Ruth McFarlane (W1)

Sheltered Under His Wing.

This is how I have felt over the past 14 months, along with **Guided, Protected and Strengthened.**

December 21, I visited my sister-in-law at Tea Gardens for Christmas. While I was there my niece came to see me, dusty after having just completed a garden in a new house her husband had just built. She saw the difficulty I was having standing and walking because of my arthritic knees.

That night she and her husband took the new home owner out for dinner to hand over his keys to him. The dinner conversation came round to what do you do and the chap said "I am a knee surgeon, but I only operate on difficult knees." My niece said "You should see my aunt." He said he would, phone numbers were exchanged and in February I went for my first visit. Before this I had dismissed the idea of surgery because I have for years suffered with thrombosis, blood clots in my legs that led to two pulmonary embolisms, one clot passing through my heart before lodging in my lung.

The Doctor treating me in emergency that day said he didn't know how I was there, to which I replied, "Well, He has something more for me to do." Back to my knees. I was booked to have surgery in May but was extremely grateful when I received a phone call telling me I could be done next week, in March. (Covid cancellation) I had no time to think about or worry just did what I was told and turned up. **(Guided?)**

All went well, back into rehab a week later and seeing my doctor again for follow up in May. The date was set for my next knee, September, but again this was brought forward because of Covid cancellations. Only four days to prepare again so no time to worry or stress. **(Protected?)**

The second op in July went well, throughout both experiences I had very little pain and felt constantly supported and guided by our wonderful Lord. Come January 23, I felt so well, had been dieting, exercising and walking and felt the healthiest I had for about fifteen years. My grand daughter was home in Canberra for Christmas, I hadn't seen her for two years because of Covid restrictions, and felt a real urge to go to Canberra to see her before she went back to Tasmania. So, packed up and drove down on January 23rd. It was a long drive, usually five hours but I was caught up in traffic at Campbelltown so it ended up taking six and a half hours. Lots of traffic, through tunnels and so on. I was only in Canberra for about three hours and I had what I thought was a fall ending up in Casualty at Canberra hospital to be told I had had a heart attack. Imagine if I had been on the way down! The ramifications are mind boggling, again I felt guided and protected.

The Canberra health system is excellent. The next day I had another heart attack, the next day an angiogram and the next day a pace maker was installed. I just went along with what I was being told, feeling constantly that God was with me throughout everything. Years ago when I made my Cursillo I learnt to give my concerns to God and to leave them there. My worry isn't going to change anything. This was how I felt throughout the past fourteen months. Sheltered under His wing as I have been guided to follow Him, **strengthened** to do His will and protected always.

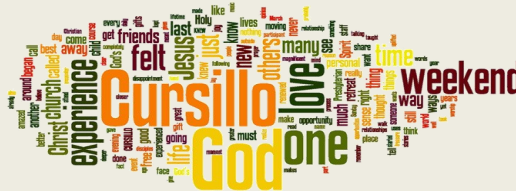

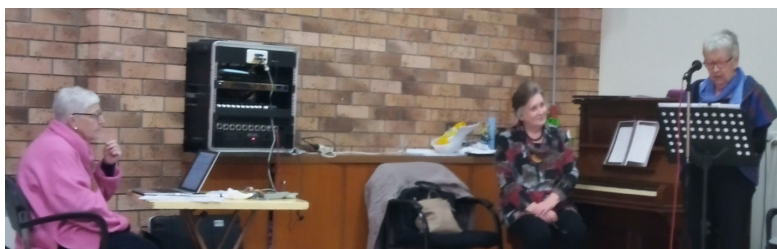

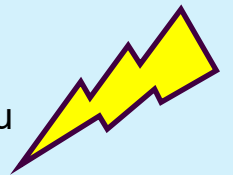


A message from The Editor

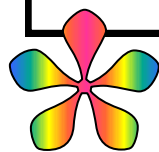
