

One of my favourite stories is St Francis and the wolf. A wolf is terrorising the town of Gubbio and when St Francis hears of it, he goes there to tame the wolf. When he meets the wolf, he arranges a peace by promising the wolf if he stops, the people of the town will make sure he doesn't go hungry.

The townsfolk agree and from then on, the wolf roams freely throughout the town, well-fed by the residents. When the wolf finally dies, he is mourned by every person in the town.


I love this story for a few reasons. The logical way of resolving the problem of the wolf is to hunt him down and kill him. St Francis' way is conflict resolution. Both sides have to want to repair the relationship and both sides have to give something up. The ending that would have happened if the village hunted down the wolf would have been

cheering his death. The ending we get, though, is sorrow at the wolf's death.

Conflict resolution is never easy. We will often put ourselves in the initial role of the villagers; "I've done nothing wrong, it is all the other person's fault". Can we open ourselves to the possibility both of us need to change? Maybe this relationship can be salvaged?

We can't make the other person come to the table, but I never want to be the one who is the obstacle to reconciliation. I don't have to give up everything. I don't have to let the other person walk all over me, but I do want to be sitting at the table with an open mind and a listening ear.



At the time of writing this report we are looking forward to our first combined weekend, MW51, to be held at Catalina Conference Centre Rathmines 22–25 August. Lyn Wickham and her team are doing a great job at their training days. Please continue to pray for male and women candidates for the weekend!

When looking to sponsor someone, please ensure that you speak to your parish priest before approaching the person you think would be a great candidate.

A workshop was held at St John's Raymond Terrace on 6 July to look at how Cursillo in the Newcastle Diocese can move forward into the future. There were 35 people in attendance and we looked at the results of the survey sent out to all Cursillistas.

Anglican Women will be holding their Spring Celebration on 3 September at St Peters Church Hall, Bank Street East Maitland, 9am–2pm. All Anglican Women are encouraged to attend. We are all Anglican Women!

Women Celebrating Their Faith will be on 7 September at St John's Raymond Terrace, 9am–3pm, cost \$40.

4th Day Welcome will be held on 14 September at St John's Raymond Terrace, 9.30am–1pm, BYO lunch.

In October the National Secretariat will be holding their meeting in Newcastle on the 25–27 October at Wallsend Diggers Club. The Diocesan Ultreya will be incorporated with this meeting at Wallsend Diggers. The Ultreya will be followed by a dinner at the Club for anyone who would like to attend. Registration and cost for dinner will be announced as soon as we are notified by the National Secretariat.

As we will be losing some members from Secretariat this year, please continue to pray for your Secretariat as we look for Cursillistas to take their place. We will need a Co-Lay Director, Spiritual Advisor, Secretary, a Treasurer (with Xero knowledge), 4th day Application and Promotion positions filled.

CURSILLO WEEKEND PLANNING DAY

I want to thank the 35 Cursillistas who attended on July 6, and worked with us to consider Cursillo and how to keep it going. I also want to thank Susie Foster for her work preparing, issuing and analysing our questionnaire. The 114 people who responded (and thanks to them, too) provided us with much food for thought, and some challenges.

Many said the Cursillo weekend is perfect. 75% said the weekend had a perfect balance of talks and activities and we received a 4.4 star rating out of 5. Well done! Many said it was a bit long (46%); however, that leaves the other half who thought it was perfect.

In short, many and conflicting answers. Quite a bit of time was spent reviewing and discussing the questionnaire and it's implications. Some constructive feedback and suggestions from the survey revolved around getting enough time for processing thoughts, integrating some physical activities and more rest, and other ideas or concerns that will be useful to know in communicating the weekend, planning, and general awareness.

Reflecting on those who believe Cursillo is just right as it is (and that is a significant cohort) emphasises that any change to Cursillo must be carefully considered and intentional. On the other hand, the fact we are down to only 7 Dioceses active in Cursillo in Australia (and by the time you read this Sydney will have had their closing down celebration of achievements, too) highlights that we must undertake some changes if we are to continue our ministry into the future.

Secretariat has considered and implemented some changes reflecting what is already in place in other Dioceses across Australia. For MW 51 we will trial a mixed Cursillo, with a mixed team, and an intentional ratio of men and women on team, segregated table communities, and some combined talks. We did not recommend limited durations for talks and will only have a small number of combined talks. We decided not to move to a 2-day Cursillo weekend. The Team, with Secretariat support, managed to bring Clausura earlier (about 3 pm) and it is expected most participants will be home before dark.

Secretariat is not considering any further changes to MW51 and we are now leaving it in the Team's capable and prayerful hands to deliver.

Once that was discussed the 35 who attended were divided into 3 Groups for discussions under 3 Themes:

- Introducing Cursillo to (potential) Candidates
- Content of the 3 day Cursillo
- Strengthening the 4th Day

Out of interest, the third Group were given a running sheet for a 2-day Cursillo weekend from another Diocese and were asked to tell us what had to go back in.



They were somewhat surprised when they did not actually have much to say. Lively discussion followed. Thank you to all who were involved.

CURSILLO PRAYER CHAIN

James wrote, "The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective." (James 5.15-16)

God always answers our prayers, although sometimes the answers are not what we hope for, since God knows everything, not just what we see or understand.

Our Cursillo prayer chain has seen some amazing answers to prayer; we could even describe them as miraculous. Other times, the answers have been much more subtle, and we may not have even recognised them as answers until we looked back with 20/20 hindsight. But, Jesus assures us: "So I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours." (Mark 11.24)

For those of you who are unsure as to how to request prayers, it is really quite simple. Having received permission from the person or people involved, you can contact your Deanery contact, or contact the Prayer Chain Coordinator (that's me until the end of the year). Please don't include personal information unless you have explicit permission. We need the name of the person giving permission, the name of the person or people we will be praying for, and a brief description of the situation (e.g Joe Blow is having an operation on Tuesday). God knows the rest.

If you contact your Deanery contact, they will email me with the information. I will then email all Deanery contacts, as well as Secretariat members. Deanery contacts will then contact Parish contacts or Cursillistas in their Deanery, if there aren't current Parish contacts.

It is also good to, if possible, pass on follow-up information, once again with permission. For example, "Joe wishes to thank everyone for their prayers. His operation went well and he is recovering as anticipated."

Thank you for your ministry of prayer.

"The Lord is my companion, I shall never be alone, He walks with me every day, and rests with me every evening.



MW51 CURSILLO WEEKEND REPORT (22-25 AUGUST, 2024)

The Commissioning of the team for MW51 was held on Saturday 25 May at St Thomas, Cardiff. The Eucharist was celebrated by Rev'd Alison Wooden and team members were commissioned by Rev'd Judy Walsh. The Diocesan Cursillo Spiritual Director, Father Mark Cooper, was unable to attend due to a commitment away from Newcastle. Team training



commenced following the commissioning service. It is an honour to work with a team of wonderful men and women who are very committed to the Cursillo movement!

MW51 is the first combined i.e. Men's and Women's Cursillo weekend held in the Newcastle Diocese. Combined weekends have been held in all Australian Dioceses with active Cursillo movements and in Hong Kong. The financial constraints of holding Cursillo weekends have been a primary factor leading to combined weekends. The Newcastle Anglican Cursillo Movement is self-funded which means that our endeavours, e.g. Cursillo weekends, publication of The Encourager, to bring our sisters and brothers into a closer relationship with our Lord and the strengthening of our Christian journey is funded through donations, payment by Cursillistas of their annual fees and the Cursillo weekend accommodation costs.

During MW51 the integrity of candidates will be upheld by arranging table communities into women only and men only. We have a female Spiritual Advisor and a male Spiritual Advisor on the team to provide support to candidates as necessary.

Please consider sponsoring a candidate for MW51!

Your prayerful support of the team members and candidates attending MW51 will be a valued selfless act of love. A brief, positive, sincere message i.e. a Palanca letter, preferably handwritten, will also show your support. During early August a list of candidates will be distributed throughout deaneries and updated as we draw closer to the weekend.

MW51 represents a change in the way Cursillo weekends have previously been conducted in our Diocese. For some Cursillistas this change may not be easy to accept. However, to enable the Newcastle Anglican Cursillo Movement to flourish it is incumbent upon us to adapt to the realities of the constraints faced in our society.



MEN'S KAIROS INSIDE (KI) ST HELIER'S UPDATE

ST HELIER'S UPDATE



Greetings Cursillo Vets,

I thought whilst updating you all on Kairos Inside (KI) at St Helier's for 2024 I'd give a brief history to our new vets on this life-changing ministry to the lives of many, many men and their families on both sides of the "barb wire fence", since this Diocese first introduced the program through the Anglican & Catholic Cursillo Movements back in October 1997. It is very encouraging to note that over the 27 years of KI in the Hunter Region, Cursillistas have made great contributions to this ministry, and continue to do so.

Over the years at St Heliers KI Men's (as of April 2017) about 250 inmates have attended these short courses run at the Correctional Centres. Whilst KI is a male ministry of men ministering to men, we are blessed in our Hunter Correctional Centres that the chaplains have encouraged the catering, agape, and prayer teams, which are made up predominately of women, to be part of the inside team. This is unique to the Hunter with our women being an essential part of the team. Some of the "men in green" describe talking with the women like talking to their mum or grandmother and it's a valued opportunity. This uniqueness has allowed Kairos to thrive and it is the "men in green" who benefit!

Reading a copy of the Encourager, Issue #26 of 1997, on page 11, it shows the list of men and women who volunteered to be on that very first team of KI #1 Men's Cessnock. The final team of 38, of which 20 were Anglican Cursillistas, was led by Cursillista John Anderson and on the preceding pages 8 and 9 of that issue, John gave a great description of what KI was about, and how the wider Christian Community could support this special ministry. The support was certainly given, and all participants of KI 1 Cessnock Community were truly blessed over the 4 days and witnessed the Holy Spirit changing lives for good! Who could ever forget the closing ceremony on that Friday night! This blessing, life-changing event for KI guests still continues today!

Well it's 27 years later, and we still have active, however aging, Kairos volunteer communities at St Helier's (Muswellbrook). Our current volunteers, some from the early years, are now a lot older, but still full of joy and enthusiasm as they serve Christ in His command to "visit those in prison", sharing all the incredible blessings that come from a Christian Community in Action.

We are always after more volunteers, to swell our ranks, in bringing the Gospel message of faith, hope and love to the "men in green".

A comment from a St Helier's chaplain really sums up what Kairos is about: "*It brings mature men and women of faith into a Correctional Centre as leaven from which friendships can develop and grow. It helps people feel important and remember that they are not forgotten.*"


