Dear Cursillistas,


Another busy year is about to come to an end, and what a busy year it was! I hope you are all looking forward to celebrating the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. As we celebrate, let us remember those who are not able to celebrate this year due to war, homelessness, natural disasters, illness and grief.

Following Geoff finishing his 3-year term and no-one feeling called to the role of Diocesan Co-Lay Director (DLD), Secretariat made the decision to trial having one Diocesan Co-Lay Director. Being Diocesan Lay Director is a huge role and I have found that having the second DLD would be very beneficial in being able to share the load.

Secretariat made the decision to move from a 3-day weekend to a 2-day weekend in 2025. This was a big step for the Secretariat to take. Lots of discussion on how it would work, what needed to be left out and whether it would still have the authenticity of the 3-day weekend. Bathurst Diocese had already experienced 2-day Cursillo so we stepped out in faith and followed the program Bathurst had used. Some talks were combined, so there were 10 talks instead of 15 and the authenticity was retained of the 3-day weekend. Graham Eagleton and his amazing team coped with the changes extremely well. They were certainly a caring, cohesive team and a blessing to the 12 candidates during the weekend. The theme was "God Is Love" and the team and candidates certainly felt the Holy Spirit and Gods love surrounding them all weekend.

The ongoing problem of keeping the roll up to date continues to be a priority. Our wonderful Encourager Editor Susie is doing a great job updating the roll, but it continues to be a work in progress. Please, if you know of anyone who is not getting their Encourager, has moved, passed away, changed their contact details or doesn't want to be involved anymore, please let us know. We are attempting to send out most Encouragers by email as sending by snail mail is quite expensive; however, we will continue to do snail mail if we need to.

Ultreyas continue to be held within deaneries, mainly Central Coast, Lake Macquarie and Newcastle. Patterson helps out at Clausura or Mananita, but sadly, have not held an Ultreya for a few years. However, I hope to encourage the deanery to hold one during 2026. Manning and Upper Hunter deaneries do not have any deanery contact and Maitland would like to find a new deanery contact. If anyone is feeling called to these ministries, please speak to me.



The number of people at Ultreyas, Clausura, Mananita, and other involvement is decreasing due to age, distance, ill health, everyone being busy and poor communication. Secretariat will be endeavouring to overcome communication problems in the new year. During the year our 4th Day and Servant Community co-ordinator on Secretariat resigned the position, which had made communication between Secretariat and Cursillistas very difficult. Fortunately, Lorraine Pearce-Adams has agreed to take on this role in 2026.

Cursillo, Mothers' Union and Anglican Women sponsored 'Women Celebrating Our Faith' at All Saints Nelson Bay on Saturday 20th September. Rev Kimberlee Hodges was the guest speaker and she gave an excellent talk on 'Hope'. There were about 57 women in attendance who enjoyed morning tea and lunch supplied by the catering group from Hope Cottage an outreach group from All Saints. WCOF will be held once again in 2027 with the venue and date to be confirmed.

Have you paid your yearly subscription yet this year? In case you have forgotten or don't know about it, the yearly subs are \$30 per person or \$50 per couple. I know that some feel if we are emailing Encouragers then why do we need to pay subs? Cursillo cannot exist if we don't have any money behind us. We do have to cover costs such as the Registration and insurance for the trailer, our Post Office box, Copyright costs, replacement of equipment and goods to run weekends, sending delegates to National Secretariat, as well as the deposit for the weekend accommodation and catering. So if you haven't paid your subs please see Marea. She would be happy to take your money or give you details for direct debit. Direct debit information is also always on the back of the Encourager.

I have just come back from the National Secretariat Meeting in Launceston. It was great to be able to share what is happening with Cursillo in other Dioceses around the country. There are only 8 Dioceses functioning at the moment; however, Bathurst Diocese is having a few problems and may need to go into recess. Bishop Carol Wagner who was assistant Bishop in Canberra/Goulburn Diocese was commissioned as the National Episcopal Adviser and our own Rev Alison Wooden was commissioned as the National Treasurer. There is currently no nomination for the National Spiritual adviser.

It is becoming quite difficult to get people to take on vacant positions on Secretariat, servant community or Cursillo weekend team members.

### Summer Joys...

I love the beach, or any cool pool of water to submerge myself in during the summertime.

Although I must admit I'm one of those people who won't go fully into the water until its either a scorching hot day (i.e. 40 or above) or it's at least the middle of January when the water temperature is a bit more civilised, thank you very much!

But 'the beach' and the 'like' speak to me of Summer Joys...

'Joys' because summer is often a time that brings holidays, slower routines, moments of fun and play with loved ones. Joy also because I find that in the season of summer I experience an 'internal shift' that seeks to intentionally find times to be still, to rest, and to hear God's words of peace into my weary places. I wonder if you do, too?

Scripture reminds us that this intentionality isn't just for the summertime. And it's not some luxury we ought to seek after, or make time for in summer alone. Rest, scripture tells us, is God's gift to us:

*"He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he restores my soul..."* (Psalm 23:2-3)

Today, I run my own photography and graphic design/printing business. I am married to Cheryl, and we have two grown children.


I worship at The Church of the Good Shepherd in Kotara South, and I have been a committed Christian since 2005.

My ministry passion at present is coordinating a Playgroup every Monday.

# WELCOME DAY MW52 REFLECTION/REPORT

## WELL, HOW DO YOU PRONOUNCE 'CURSILLO'?

A video from St Albans, in London was used to give an overview of Cursillo and shared a number of people's comments on how Cursillo had positively impacted their lives. The whole point being made was "**Cursillo is a movement of the Church providing a method by which Christians are empowered to grow through PRAYER, STUDY and ACTION and enabled to share God's love with everyone**".

BUT in the video, they used a different pronunciation, reflecting the Spanish origin of Cursillo.

A diagram showed how the program had travelled from Spain to Spanish-speaking South America then to USA and Canada, where it was translated into English. From Canada it came to Australia via the Diocese of Goulburn (1979).

The origins are reflected in key words used in the program, namely:

*Palanca*

*Ultreya*

*Mananita*

And our challenging song '*De Colores*'

**WELL, God is good!** A member of our MW52 team, Ed Hernando, being born in South America, had Spanish as his first language. '*De Colores*' with its emphasis on creation (seasons, nature, creatures, etc.) and God's gift of Christ to us, always gives us varied pronunciations. We are not sure if we would pass Spanish at School, but we appreciated Ed's help (and giggled a bit!) and the refreshment of our understanding.

*Palanca* is a lever (and Barb Warland covered aspects of prayer (our 'lever') in her presentation).

*Ultreya* is encouragement (This was the topic of Fr Peter Anderson's meditation).

*Mananita* definitely provided an early morning surprise at our weekend (compared with early morning birthday celebrations, which is the origin of the word).

Our weekend Lay Leader, Graham Eagleton, produced a very measured account of the weekend, the challenges and the joys, providing thanks and encouragement. His modesty and openness, greatly appreciated.

Group Reunion, which included groups formed from the table communities from MW52, produced a wonderful 'buzz' in the room. Noelene Lentfer's talk (on Ultreya and Group Reunion) had obviously 'sparked a fire'!

## WHAT'S NEXT?

Our program concluded with a presentation by our DSD, Rev'd Toni Wein, giving an outline for the future following the weekend.

It was emphasised that together we are called to build God's kingdom, one step at a time.

Hence the motto: **Make a friend, Be a friend, Bring that friend gently to Jesus.**

Rev'd Toni then unpacked the concept of the Fourth Day including Group Reunions, Prayer and Gatherings.

We are very grateful to our MC, Jim Warland, for his leadership – and his "flight plan concept for the day"!

As usual the singing was joyful!

A sincere thanks to God for the blessing of all involved in Welcome Day for MW52.
